When AGA rebranded in 2022—transitioning from the *Association of Government Accountants* to *Advance Grow Accelerate*—I must admit I was not a fan. Most of our members are government accountants and auditors, and I had always seen AGA as a unique space where professionals in our field could gather, learn, and “geek out” together. To me, changing the name felt like taking away the very reason I joined. Public accountants have the Society of CPAs, I thought—so why shouldn’t government accountants have AGA?

But earlier this year, at my first LEAD conference in April 2025, I came to understand why the rebranding matters. The atmosphere was unlike anything I expected. With federal layoffs driving up unemployment, there was a real sense of uncertainty in the air. Yet at the same time, there was excitement and hope. For decades, many of us believed government jobs—especially at the federal level—were the most stable and secure careers. Now, that confidence had been shaken. Some board members had already lost their positions and were facing their own struggles. And yet, what I witnessed was remarkable: people joining together, lifting one another up, and serving through AGA.

Members who were unemployed or unsure about their future still gave their time to educate others—helping chapters stay strong, maintaining memberships, sharing job leads, even covering dues for those in need. They offered training, networking opportunities, and guidance on best practices—all to help their peers advance their careers and continue to serve with excellence.

That’s when it clicked for me: *Advance Grow Accelerate* is more than a name. It’s a mindset.

- **Advance** even in uncertain times.
- **Grow** in your career and as a person, finding the right fit for you.
- **Accelerate** by moving forward, even when the path seems blocked.

## Chapter CGFM Plan for 2025 - 2026

The Charleston WV Chapter plans to promote the CGFM certification by building awareness of the CGFM, encouraging members to obtain the CGFM designation and supporting current CGFM members.

### CGFM Candidate Support

- Host CGFM study groups both in person as well as virtual.
- Provide CGFM candidates with mentors that have been through the program.
- Provide CGFM candidates with the most up to date study guides through the chapter's lending library.
- Build the number of CGFMs in the Charleston Chapter by 10 members passing all parts of the exam.
- Reimburse members who meet the following criteria:
  - Pass any part of the CGFM exam
  - Employer did not pay for the exam
  - Has not already been reimbursed by the AGA for the exam cost for that part
  - Apply within 90 days of passing the exam
- Provide an additional discount at Charleston AGA Conferences for those with the CGFM designation.

### CGFM Support

- Provide CPE opportunities to CGFMs by utilizing the luncheons.
- Retain at least 80% of current CGFMs.
- Promote CPE and other training opportunities utilizing the newsletters/website.
- Provide CGFMs with an opportunity to submit training ideas for future CPE.
- Provide current CGFMs with an opportunity to mentor CGFM candidates.

### CGFM Awareness

- Promote CGFM month on the Charleston Chapter's Linked-in page and newsletter.
- Provide a CGFM awareness presentation at AGA Charleston conferences and luncheons.
- Have current CGFMs write articles for the newsletter about their CGFM experience.
- Promote CGFM awareness through emails to all Chapter Members.
- Provide an informational packet all about the CGFM to anyone interested.
- Promote the benefits of holding the CGFM designation.
- Encourage the Governor to make a declaration for March to be CGFM month.

## Why become a Certified Government Financial Manager (CGFM)?

Since 1994, the CGFM program has helped many become proficient in all skills necessary to become an expert government financial manager. When it comes to the government environment, the financial process differs significantly from what you would see in the private sector. Unlike businesses that focus on profits to gauge success, government entities focus on accountability, transparency, and the efficient and effective use of tax dollars, grants, and other government resources. The CGFM program provides an overall view of how federal, state, and local governments operate starting from the basics of formation and financing to performance measurement, auditing, and the development of reports to communicate the status of the government to law makers, investors, creditors, and most importantly, its citizens.

The CGFM program breaks down all this information into three different areas, the general government environment, governmental accounting, financial reporting, and budgeting, and general governmental financial management and controls. This material may only be partially covered or sometimes not covered at all in a standard four-year accounting program. The CGFM program bridges all the gaps you may have in your knowledge of government financial management. The AGA provides many resources to help you throughout the process with many opportunities to save money. Whether you work in an area of government finance at a government agency or are a CPA that provides services to government agencies, becoming a CGFM is great for anyone involved in any area or level of government.

## **Interested in earning your CGFM? The AGA Charleston Chapter is here to help!**

### **- What is the CGFM?**

- o The CGFM or Certified Government Financial Manager is a professional certification awarded by AGA, demonstrating competency in governmental accounting, auditing, financial reporting, internal controls and budgeting at the federal, state and local levels.

### **- Why earn the CGFM?**

- o Going through the CGFM program gives you the knowledge and experience needed to be an effective government financial manager.
- o Most four year accounting programs just have one governmental accounting class and it may not even be required to graduate. The CGFM program focuses solely on government financial management. This helps government accountants and auditors fill in the knowledge gaps to see the big picture of government.
- o The CPA exams focuses mainly on accounting for businesses with a small part relating to government. The CGFM will fill in any gaps in government that are not covered on the CPA exams.
- o Earning the CGFM gives you an advantage in government financial management and opens many doors to higher level positions.
- o Earning the CGFM increases your professional confidence.
- o The WV Division of Personnel (DOP) and many other state agencies not under DOP offer up to a 5% raise for earning the CGFM.

### **- How can the AGA Charleston Chapter help you earn your CGFM?**

- o FREE study groups / virtual CGFM classes are offered to candidates with busy work schedules.
- o FREE access to our study guide lending library. Study guides range from \$95 to \$120. Our chapter will let you borrow a study guide for free while you study for the exams.

- o **Exam Reimbursement**

- The AGA Charleston Chapter will reimburse candidates for their exam fees if the following is met:
  - Candidate is a member of the AGA Charleston Chapter
  - The Candidate passed the exam.
  - The Candidate's employer did not pay for the exam.
